


## **COMMUNITY-WIDE ACES SCORE REPORT**

Additionally, there is a strong sense of disconnection within the community, with many feeling a lack of mutual support among residents. Concerns about income and economic stability are also prominent, as insufficient income limits access to better housing and essential health resources.
